## Return of the plungers – Hidden strategists, war hawks, silent profiteers 1914 and today

Wolfgang Effenberger, born in 1946, gained valuable insights into the insanity of armed military juggernauts during the times of the cold war as a captain in the German army. Being a declared expert for geopolitical problems and the author of several books, he actively promotes peace.

Willy Wimmer, born in 1943, used to be a member of the German congress belonging to the German conservative party (Christian Democratic Union) for 33 years. In addition, he held several offices, e.g. as a parliamentary state secretary (number two in the hierarchy) of the federal minister of defense responsible for the political structure of the German military after the reunification and for the correspondence with the Soviet troops in Germany. He also acted as a vice president of the parliamentary assembly of the KSZE/OSZE where he conducted conversations on the highest governmental level around the globe. During the wars in Yugoslavia and Iraq that violated international law, he attracted special attention by his pointed public statements as well as by his complaint of unconstitutionality during the dispute regarding Afghanistan.
